CHANGES TO CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The attention of the Bidders is directed to the following changes to the Contract Documents:

CONSTRUCTION DRAWINGS

New Drawings – NONE

Drawings to be Amended –

1. Drawing Sheet S1.0 – EXISTING OXIDATION DITCH PLAN

a. **AMEND** notes to read:

“After spot repairs are made, spray on a single ½” coat of SikaRepair 224 to inside of tank walls and base”

2. Drawing Sheet S2.0 – UV TANK AND PAVILION FOUNDATION PLAN AND DETAILS

a. On UV Tank Section View. At joint between wall and base slab **ADD** note to read:

“6”x 3/16” PVC ribbed center bulb waterstop between wall and base slab by SIKA or approved equal.

3. Drawing Sheet S2.1 – PAVILION ROOF FRAMING PLAN AND DETAILS

a. **ADD** note to Section 3/S2.1 that reads:

“The UV canopy roof shall be a standing seam roof with 13” wide x1” deep x 24 gage galvalume plank style panels and Kynar 500 coating. #30 felt paper shall be installed on top of the plywood sheathing. The standing seam roof is to be attached through the felt paper and into

the plywood sheathing. The fascia shall be 12” wide x 1” deep x 24 gage galvalume flat style panels with Kynar 500 coating. The owner shall pick the color from the manufacturers range of standard colors.”

PROJECT MANUAL

New Documents – NONE

Documents to be Replaced –

1. DAVIS BACON FEDERAL WAGE RATES

- a. **DELETE** the original Heavy Construction Wage Rate section in its entirety and **REPLACE** with the section attached to this Addendum
- b. **DELETE** the original Building Construction Wage Rate section in its entirety and **REPLACE** with the section attached to this Addendum

Documents to be Amended–

1. SECTION 407113 – MAGNETIC FLOW METERS - Paragraph 2.3, Transmitters

- a. **DELETE** paragraph 2.3, E in its entirety.

BIDDER QUESTIONS/ANSWERS

- 1) Are the submersible pump disconnect switches intended to be replaced? If yes, will the existing disconnect structure be reused?

Disconnects are to be replaced. Vertical supports remain, and horizontal structures are to be replaced. See Detail 1 on C1.01.

- 2) Does the mag flow meter require a new conduit into the vault or is there an existing?

The existing mag meter signal wire back to the building remains for reuse. The new conduit shown on the site plans is to house the wiring for the pump over temp and seal failure.

- 3) The coating in the Oxidation Ditch is specified as Sika Monotop-4400-MIC. The thickness is not noted or specified. How thick should this product be applied to this existing concrete structure?

The specified product and thickness has been revised per this addendum.

- 4) Sika Monotop-4400-MIC is a UK / European Product that is NOT available in the US. Can you provide us with an alternative product that is available here, that can be used instead?

The specified product has been revised per this addendum.

- 5) The installation method recommended by the Montop-4400-MIC seems to be “mechanical” in nature, as in spray-on, maybe in the form of a gunite or shotcrete process. That approach to application sounds appealing due to the quantity (8100 sqft or 675 CF at 1” thick), but we need a product that will work with that process and something area waterproofing experts can obtain and use.

The specified product has been revised per this addendum. A spray on application is acceptable per manufacturers recommendations.

- 6) We understand we must remove and haul away the sludge from the sludge holding tank; this is covered by Allowance #2. We also must remove the sludge from the Oxidation Ditch before starting the Ditch Restoration & Coating Work. We assume this sludge could be drained or pumped somehow from the Ditch to the Sludge Holding Tank. Is the removal, pumping, relocating of the sludge from the Ditch to the Tank part of the Allowance #2 – and the subsequent Haul Away also included in the Allowance? This is an unknown quantity or volume of removal & hauling.

As it is an unknown quantity, any offsite hauling and disposal can be covered under Allowance #2. On site transfer or dewatering work as required by construction activities should be included in the base bid.

- 7) Concerning the UV Tank, drawing S2.0 (and D6.01). Would Waterstop be required at all construction joints, such as between the base slab and the vertical walls? If so, what type of waterstop are we to use? Rx-Bentonite strip? PVC? What width? Can the entirety of the UV tank walls be constructed in one pour, or are vertical construction joints required along the longer walls?

A waterstop between the slab and the wall of the UV tank has been added by this addendum. The walls can be constructed in one pour if the contractor chooses to do so.

- 8) What is the required thickness for the Sika MonoTop - 4400 layer?

The specified product and thickness has been revised per this addendum.

- 9) What type of Roof would you like on the UV Canopy Structure? Painted Corrugated Metal? Galvanized Corrugated Metal? Placed on furring strips? Direct application of an asphalt shingles system? What type of fascia is needed? Are you leaving the underside of the wood truss structure exposed? Should Bird Netting be applied to the bottom of the wood trusses? Structural drawings stop at 5/8” plywood roof sheathing & basic framing.

Additional Information on the roof system has been provided per this addendum. An exposed truss is acceptable. Bird netting is not required.

- 10) There is a comprehensive and very direct specification covering Dewatering requirements on this project; the way this specification is written it seems absolute and not “as might be required”. However, we cannot find a Soils Report or any other information concerning where (or if) groundwater might be present, or any other existing soil conditions of the site and property. Where any Soil Borings done? Can you forward us a copy of the soils report?

Dewatering should be bid per the spec. We do NOT have a soils report for the site but do not expect adverse soils conditions or significant groundwater issues at the time of construction. If excessive measures become necessary during construction, they can be addressed via contract modification at that time.

PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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Note: Executive Order (EO) 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors applies to all contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract is awarded (and any solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2017. If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must provide employees with 1 hour of paid sick leave for every 30 hours they work, up to 56 hours of paid sick leave each year. Employees must be permitted to use paid sick leave for their own illness, injury or other health-related needs, including preventive care; to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is ill, injured, or has other health-related needs, including preventive care; or for reasons resulting from, or to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is a victim of, domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking. award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage

determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
