The following notes, changes, additions, and replacements shall be incorporated into the Project Manual or drawings as applicable:

ITEM 1. Bid Date Extension

- A. To allow contractors additional time for finalizing bids due to the frequency of questions and addendums, the due date for bids has also been extended to **1PM on Friday, January 30th, with the bid opening to be held at 1:15PM**. See the attached updated Bid Form for date and time information changes.
- B. Questions will still be due by Friday, January 16th as indicated in Addendum #1.

ITEM 2. Bid Form Modifications

- A. Since the Bid Form only has three lines to Acknowledge the Addendums, the contractor shall write in each additional Addendum on the margins to acknowledge all remaining Addendums with the dates.
- B. The Bid form has been updated to reflect the updated Bid Due date and time.

ITEM 3. Question Responses

- A. On the next page are responses to the following previously submitted questions:

Question #1:

What are the existing wood pier piles treated with? Example: Copper, Chromium and Arsenic (CCA-C) or Creosote. Creosote-treated lumber requires a special permit for disposal at specific Landfills. Please Advise.

Response #1:

The existing wood piers, to the best of the Town's knowledge, were not pre-treated. If during removal of the existing pier, it is determined that piers were pre-treated, the piers are to be segregated and addressed by others.

Question #2:

To what extent is G.C. responsible for Site Restoration?

Response #2:

The G.C. is responsible for site restoration of the landing area in the footprint of the pier, areas disturbed by the contractor during the removal and construction of the pier and the subsequent staging area of materials.

Question #3:

Is there a specific reason dedicated time work is prohibited? As presented in the Project Manual, under the current NYS DEC Permit, NATURAL RESOURCE PERMIT CONDITIONS, page 2, Item 4, which states, "**Work Prohibition Period**. Construction activities in the lake are prohibited during the period of May 1st through June 30th."

Response #3:

This timeframe is a NYS DEC restriction to protect fish spawning timeframes, **work shall not be conducted in- water at that time.**

Following discussions w/ NYSDEC, the following clarifications were provided regarding this restriction during the May 1 to June 30 timeframe.

1. Turbidity Curtain shall be installed prior to May 1st or after June 30th.
2. Motorized equipment, boats, or vibrations affecting the lake bed shall not be used in-water within the work zone or on piers during this work period.
3. Removal or installation of piles shall not be conducted during this timeframe. Vibrations, noise, and sedimentation are the the main concern.
4. If removals of the top of the existing pier were to be conducted during this time direct coordination with NYS DEC shall be done the ensure no materials fall into the water. Vibrations, noise, and sedimentation are the main concern.
5. If proposed pier piles are installed prior to May 1st, work on top of the proposed pier can be conducted as long as operations do not come into contact with water, again direct coordination with NYS DEC shall be done to ensure that no materials fall into the water. Vibrations, noise, and sedimentation are the main concern.
6. On shore work can be conducted during this timeframe, however any work done directly adjacent to the waterline will require that a turbidity curtain shall be installed prior to May 1st just offshore to ensure any materials that may enter the water have no impact to fish spawning during the time period.

Question #4:

If the contractor provides substitute Decking material that achieves the 50-year warranty, will it be accepted?

Response #4:

If the contractor intends to provide a substitute material it shall be listed in accordance to Item #5 of the Bid Form and meet the requirements of Specification Section 01 6000 Product Requirements, it will be considered. The owner has final say as to accept the intended substitute decking material and any cost implications that may need to be considered on the final decision.

A 50 year warranty on pier materials is required.

If the delegated design option is selected, the successful bidder or its delegated engineer is responsible for creating the detailed design documents, which must then be sealed by a licensed professional. A 50 year warranty on pier materials is required.
